


Walk of Fame

Walk of Fame Honors Hollywood Entertainers

Hollywood is known as the "Entertainment Capital of the World." To honor the great performers and artists who created the movies and other forms of entertainment we see today, the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce created the **Walk of Fame**.


On more than five acres of terrazzo sidewalk, the Walk of Fame celebrates the achievements of performers in the motion picture, television, radio, music recording and live theater industries. The first stars were installed in 1958 with a dedication ceremony that featured eight movie actors, including Joanne Woodward, Burt Lancaster and Ronald Coleman. By 1960, more than 1,500 celebrities were honored with stars on the Walk of Fame, which stretches more than two miles along Hollywood Boulevard, from La Brea to Gower and along Vine Street from Yucca to Sunset. Anyone can nominate a celebrity to receive a star. The selection committee chooses 12 to 24 stars each year after receiving nominations from the public. The Walk of Fame is administered by the Hollywood Historic Trust.



How is the Walk of Fame Constructed?

Terrazzo is a material used for flooring or paving. It gets its name from the Italian word for "terrace." It can be poured in place or precast in various shapes in a factory. It contains chips of marble, quartz, granite or glass blended into a cement base known as a "binder" or "matrix." The terrazzo mixture is first poured and let to harden, or "cure." The rough finish is then ground to a smooth finish and polished to a shine.


Two colors of terrazzo are used for the Hollywood Walk of Fame. The pigment for the black terrazzo is made of black iron oxide ground into a powder. The pink coral terrazzo is a mixture of red oxide and lemon yellow oxide powders. Divider strips between the panels are made of zinc. The star symbol, emblem, and lettering are made of brass.
















